- **Free Thank You Meals for First Responders and County Officials:** We are humbled by the selflessness of first responders and county officials working tirelessly to help and feel honored to provide free combo meal to uniformed first responders in the area. Uniformed police, firefighters, paramedics, ARC volunteers, military, National Guard, Coast Guard, Park Rangers and county officials who show a badge are invited to Jack in the Box restaurants in the greater Houston area for a free combo September 6 through September 12.
